



CITY KIDS LITTLE STARS' HEALTH GUIDELINES

To minimise the spread of infectious illnesses amongst children, we ask that all children and adults staying for the session use hand sanitiser on arrival at City Kids and pay attention to personal hygiene. Children who have a fever or show any signs of illness should not attend Little Stars. Please contact us if your child contracts an infectious illness so that we can monitor the situation and take any appropriate action necessary.

1. Temperature and/or Vomiting

Please wait forty-eight hours from when your child last vomited or had a high temperature before bringing you child into the school.

2. Communicable Diseases

Communicable diseases are illnesses caused by microorganisms and transmitted from an infected person or animal to another person or animal. City Kids has an obligation to report the following communicable diseases to the Health Department:

- Bacillary Dysentery
- Chicken Pox
- Cholera
- Conjunctivitis
- Diphtheria
- Hand, Foot and Mouth
- Influenza H1n1
- Impetigo
- Measles
- Meningococcal Infections
- COVID-19
- Mumps
- Poliomyelitis
- Rubella
- Scarlet Fever
- Strep Throat
- Tuberculosis
- Typhoid Fever
- Viral Hepatitis A
- Viral Gastroenteritis
- Whooping Cough

(Note: this is not an exhaustive list)

If you child has any of the above diseases confirmed by a doctor, we ask that you notify City Kids as soon as possible. We are required to inform the Health Department upon notification and will also notify the other Playgroup or Preschool parents if there is an occurrence of any communicable diseases within the Playgroup or Preschool. Please be assured that we will protect confidentiality and not disclose the name of the child to other parents.

3. Temperature Taking

The Education Bureau (EDB) strongly urges all children attending Playgroups, kindergartens, Preschool and primary school to have their temperature checked before coming into contact with other children at school. If the temperature is over 99.5 degrees (F) or 37.5 degrees (C), then children should stay home.
